Airport Theft Prevention

- 1. Use TSA certified luggage locks.
- 2. Use a plastic cable tie to lock your luggage; if the tie is broken or gone when you pick up your baggage, you will know that your suitcase was opened and that you should check for missing belongings. You can also use a wide piece of packing tape in a similar manner.
- 3. Pack dirty clothes on top and new purchases on the bottom; thieves are less likely to rummage through dirty clothing.

Important Notes

- Each traveler is responsible for ensuring they have suitable clothing for the conditions and take proper care for their safety. As an example: Drink sufficient water to avoid dehydration regardless of temperature, apply sunscreen to avoid sun burn, pay attention to the variety of walking surfaces, and wear proper footwear.
- Confirm air ticket names are as per the passport immediately upon receipt. Errors need to be identified immediately so they can be corrected - at least 72 hours notice.
- Seal checked luggage with a TSA lock or plastic zap strap. If opened, check for stolen items and report to the airport.
- NEVER pack jewelry or anything of value in your checked luggage.
- Secure all valuables in the hotel safe or safety deposit box never in your luggage in the room.
- Call the insurance company for a reference number prior to seeking any medical attention. This ensures coverage and allows them to provide assistance.
- When leading a group, always have one chaperone at the front and one at the back. When proceeding through customs, using public transportation, crossing a street, turning a corner, etc., always check to ensure the group is still with you.
- When using the subway, always make sure that the group knows the stop they are to get off at, but do not assume they will see it. You will need to remind everyone.
- Never let anyone go in a group of less than 3. Four is best so that if they need help, there is never less than two people together.
- Make sure that there is a clear understanding of a meeting time and place before everyone breaks into smaller groups.
- Prior to departure, ensure all students have the following: Passport, School ID, Adequate currency, Medications in carry on, and no sharp objects or perceived weapons in carry on.
- Ensure you, the chaperone, have the following: Air tickets, Medical information for students, Signed permission forms from parents, Insurance card with phone number, Adequate currency and tip money.
- Have all luggage labeled & tagged with colored string.
- Ensure all access to adult TV channels & long distance is restricted for students.
- Students must **NEVER** leave their passport in their suitcase. They should always carry it securely with them, have it stored in the hotel safe, or leave it with a chaperone.

<u>3-1-1</u>

3-1-1 for carry-ons = Liquids in a 3 ounce bottle or less (app 100ml); ONE 1-quart sized (app 1 liter), clear, plastic, zip-top bag; ONE bag per passenger placed in screening bin. This limits the total amount of liquids each passenger can bring.

Consolidate bottles into one bag and x-ray separately to speed screening.

Be prepared. Each time TSA searches a carry-on it slows down the line. Practicing 3-1-1 will ensure a faster and easier checkpoint experience.

3-1-1 is for short trips. If in doubt, put your liquids in checked luggage.

Declare larger liquids. Prescription medications, baby formula and milk are allowed in quantities exceeding three ounces and are not required to be in the zip-top bag. Declare these items for inspection at the checkpoint.

Come early and be patient. Heavy travel volumes and the enhanced security process may mean longer lines at security checkpoints.

- + Outside dimensions (L+W+H) not to exceed 62 inches / 158 cm

ONE carry on bag

+ Outside dimensions (LxWxH) 9x15.5x21.5 " /55 x40 x 23 cm + 22lbs /10kg

ONE personal item

+ A personal item may be: a purse, lap top or briefcase (no more than 10kg/ / 22lbs + 16x33x43cm / 6x13x17cm



REMINDER:

DO NOT PACK JEWELRY, CASH, IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS, PRESCRIPTION DRUGS, CAR OR HOUSE KEYS, OR OTHER IRREPLACEABLE ITEMS IN CHECKED BAG.

If your checked bag is over weight or exceeds size limitations, you will be subject to additional charges at airport check-in.

If your carry on bag has disallowed items, you will be required to re-pack them in your checked bag or you may be required to surrender them at customs/security.



Travel Tips

- ✤ For travel outside Canada, passports are now mandatory. As group leader, we recommend that you ensure that everyone has the proper documentation. Double check that anyone without a Canadian passport has proper documentation to travel to your destination.
- → We also recommend that the group leader make 2 copies of each participant's passport. One copy is to be kept by the individual at home in a safe location (but not WITH the passport) and the second copy should be taken by the group leader to the travel destination. Should the passport be lost or stolen, the photocopy will facilitate its replacement.
- ✤ It is also highly recommended that each member of the group wear a passport pouch to hold both their passport and money.
- → Have in your possession some documentation that authorizes that the students travel with you as part of the school tour.
- ✤ Please remind the group members of your behavior expectations and consequences while on tour.
- ✤ We recommend that you obtain medical information from all your group participants.
- → Two (2) bags 1 checked and 1 carry on is suitable for any tour.
- → Because of tightened security and the huge numbers of people travelling these days, we recommend that you rendezvous with your group at the airport 3 hours prior to flight time.
- → Please check the size and weight restrictions for checked and carry on baggage and ensure that everyone's luggage meet these requirements.
- ✤ Please be very cautious with the items you have in your carry on. Anything that may be perceived as a weapon will be confiscated.

Travel Tips

- ✤ Travelling is not the time to take your best and most expensive items out of storage. The group should not take anything that you are worried about losing on the trip.
- ✤ To call home, group members should check with their own phone company on how to call home. Phone cards may be an easy solution. Cell phones are subject to roaming charges, so double check your package. International plans can be purchased from your phone company.
- ✤ So many people use black roll type suitcases these days that it can be difficult to identify the bags that belong to your group. A handy tip for assisting your group is to tie a length of colourful string or surveyors tape to the handle of each person's bags.
- Please ensure that the group understands that appropriate behavior is expected in the airports, on the airplane, in the hotels, and at all attractions.
- → We have provided you with the hotel names and phone numbers. We recommend that you provide this information to the parents. In addition, you may wish to establish a "phone tree" for the parents in the event that flights are delayed, cancelled, or missed.
- → Part of the Tourism industry is the habit of tipping for services. Please collect in advance from each participant an amount that you as a group leader can distribute to your guides and drivers. Please note that tipping in restaurants has been prepaid for all meals organized as part of your tour and additional tipping is not necessary.
- → Please discuss how your group plans to handle money. Travellers' cheques are the best way to ensure safety, but can be difficult to cash, so are not recommended. ATM machines are readily available but charge for each transaction and can be time consuming to find and use.

<u>Tipping</u>

Tipping is at the discretion of the client and should be given because the client is happy with the service. It is standard to tip in certain cases unless the service is poor. If the service is poor, we suggest providing no tip and we would like to know about it. The dollar ranges indicated below are only guidelines. If the client wishes to tip a higher amount, it is up to their discretion.

Here are some guidelines for you; all prices are quoted in USD.

□ Adult groups will normally tip \$1.00 per person and \$2.00 per person for tour guides but student groups are usually less.

Guides

- Meet & Greet without commentary & assistance \$15.00 minimum
- Meet & Greet with commentary & assistance \$1/person \$30.00 minimum
- Tour Guides varies with length/quality of tour \$1 \$2/person \$20.00 minimum

Coach Drivers

Drivers providing Transfers

- □ Without commentary or luggage assistance \$15.00 minimum
- No commentary but luggage assistance \$25.00 minimum
- □ Commentary + Luggage Service \$40.00 minimum

Drivers Providing Tours

- Driver on a short tour \$25 minimum
- Driver on a full day tour \$50 \$75

Restaurants

- Any meals arranged as part of your tour DO NOT require tipping
- Meals on Own 18% of bill recommended

Housekeeping

We suggest that you pre-collect the money (prior to the tour) and have it ready to hand to the guide in an envelope. If you choose not to tip, then just shake their hand without an envelope!

Friends, the apartments owned by the cast in the show filmed here. **Greenwich Village** (10 St. Lukes Street)

Cosby Show, this is the location of the Huxtables' home in the TV show. Refer to Walking Tour of Greenwich Village pg. 56-57

6. Katz Deli (205 East Houston - At Ludlow)

When Harry Met Sally, the famous scene with Meg Ryan and Billy Crystal takes place in this restaurant... and the food's great too! Refer to Lower Manhattan Map pg. 41

7. Midtown (Lexington & 52nd)

The Seven Year Itch, this is where the famous scene of Marilyn Monroe's dress being blown up was shot. Refer to Midtown Map pg. 42

8. The Empire State Building (34th & 5th)

Turn left and continue walking East until you reach Broadway & Canal St. Ask your Greenwich Village tour guide if you need assistance.

Little Italy

Starts: Spring Street and Lafayette Street


Nearest subway station: Spring Street and Lafayette Street

- 1. **55 Spring Street: Ceci Cela** is the sunflower yellow French pâtisserie.
- 2. Continue down **Lafayette Street** to **Doms** at No. 202. Pop in to take home some freshly made Italian sausage or something from their take-out menu.
- Turn left onto Grand Street to check out No. 186, the Italian Food Center. Next door at No. 188 is a 100-year-old cheese making shop, and at No. 190, a ravioli shop.
- Next, detour to No. 195, Ferrara's, the city's first espresso bar. Take home some almond biscotti or have a scoop of tiramisu ice cream and then turn back to turn left onto Mulberry Street.
- Mulberry Street is the heart of Little Italy, and is host to the annual Feast of San Gennaro. No. 128, Foranzo Italian Imports, sells an eclectic selection of Italian goods such as football shirts, espresso machines, and papal memorabilia. Continue to Umberto's Clam House where Mafia boss Joey Gallo was shot in 1972.
- Continue down to **Canal Street** where you can shop until your heart's content! (Walk up Canal Street and turn right on Broadway to meet the SoHo Walking Tour from step 2 - pg. 58-59)

Ends: Canal Street

Nearest subway station: Lafayette and Canal Street.

Central Park


Starts: West 72nd Street and Central Park West

Nearest subway station: 72nd Street

- Wander past the Dakota Apartments where John Lennon was tragically shot and his widow Yoko Ono still lives. See the Strawberry Fields restored to commemorate the former Beatle, and the International Peace Garden.
- 2. Continue around the left arm of the Lake to see the wooden **Cherry Hill shelter.**
- 3. Walk on the formal promenade of **The Mall** which leads up to a wisteria-draped pergola. Walk under the arch's colourful ceiling tiles, originally made by monks in 12th Century France.
- 4. The **Bethesda Fountain** was created to mark the opening of the aqueduct system that supplied the city with clean water for the first time in 1892, and is also where anti-Vietnam demonstrators used to gather.
- 5. Detour to the right of the lake to the **Loeb Boathouse** to see where rowing boats are rented and nightly Venetian gondola rides are offered.
- Head back the way you came to go around the left of the lake. Cross the **Bow Bridge**, built out of cast-iron to link Cherry Hill and the **Ramble**.
- Continue to the Swedish Cottage which is home to the Marionette Theater. Climb the steps to the Shakespeare Garden and sit on the gigantic curved stroll that doubles as a seat.
- 8. Next, see the **Belvedere Castle's** one turret. Cross the Western side of the **Great Lawn** to see where many free concerts have been given.
- 9. Overlooking the lake is the **Delacorte Theater**, where Shakespeare in the Park is held each summer.
- 10. Cross West Drive to Central Park West. Go down West 81st Street to the cube-encased globe of the **Rose Center for Earth and Space**.
- 11. Walk through the Rose Center to the **American Museum of Natural History**, the second largest natural history museum in the world.

Financial District


Starts: Battery Park - Exit of Statue Cruises @ Castle Clinton

- 1. When facing **away** from the water, cross the park on your right towards State Street. Turn Left on State Street and walk Bowling Green Park.
- 2. Continue up Broadway Street until you reach the **Charging Bull** statue. This statue represents a Bull, the symbol of aggressive financial optimism and prosperity. It is an iconic symbol of NYC and Wall Street.
- 3. Continue North on Broadway until you reach Exchange Pl. Turn Right. Continue to Broad St. Turn Left. On your left is the **New York Stock Exchange**. This is the world's largest stock exchange by market capitalization. The NYSE has a major impact on markets worldwide. In fact, the average daily trading value was app. \$169 billion USD in 2013!!!
- 4. Continue North on Broad St. Stop when you reach Wall St. **Wall Street** originally got its name from the Dutch name 'de Waal Straat'. The street name was derived from an earthen wall on the northern boundary of the New Amsterdam settlement. It is widely believed to have been used as protection from the English colonial encroachment. If you look closely, you can still find parts of the wall within the street! Wall Street is the epicenter for the financial district of NYC, which has been called both the most economically powerful city and the leading financial center of the world!
- 5. In front of you, on your right, is **Federal Hall.** Federal Hall was built in 1700 as New York City's City Hall. It later served as the first capitol building of the USA under the Constitution, as well as George Washington's inauguration as the first President of the USA. The original building was demolished, but this new building was built as a museum to represent the original.
- 6. Continuing North from your original route... you will make a quick shift left (but still heading North) taking you onto Nassau St. Continue up this street until you reach Liberty St. On your right is the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. Working with the Federal Reserve System, the NYFRB implements monetary policy, supervises and regulates financial institutions and helps maintain the nation's payment systems.
- Turn Left on Liberty Street. Continue several blocks until you reach the 9/11 Memorial & Tribute Center on your Right.

Ends: 9/11 Memorial

Nearest subway station: Cortland Street (R).



Greenwich

Starts: Sheridan Square - Subway: Christopher St. and Sheridan Sq.

- 1. **Sheridan Square** was once known as the "mousetrap" as seven streets converge at the square, confusing even the locals. It is best known as a symbol of the gay liberation movement, now the site of the annual gay Halloween Parade.
- Wander down Christopher Street to see the unique combination of gay bars and crystal shops. Turn left on Bleeker and then right down Grove. Keep an eye out on your right at the corner for 45 Grove St, the site where John Wilkes Booth planned the Assasination of Abraham Lincoln! Continue walking to Bedford.
- 3. Turn right onto Bedford. At **Bedford and Grove** (on your left) you will see the location where they shoot the *Friends* apartments and the restaurant on the corner. Continue past Commerce, notice 75 and a half Bedford Street which is only half the width of a house! Turn around.
- Turn left on Commerce Street. 38 Commerce Street is Cherry Lane Theater which started off as a farm silo and became a theater in 1924.
- Follow Commerce onto Barrow and then turn left onto Hudson Street. The Hudson River once reached the corner of Hudson and Morton Streets, but is now three blocks West.
- 6. Turn left onto **St Luke's Place** to see No. 10, the home of the Huxtables from the popular 80s TV series, *The Cosby Show*.
- Continue up Leroy and turn left onto Bleeker to try the amazing bread at Amy's and some fabulous cheese at Murray's. Then continue in the opposite direction and try the 'out of this world' pastries at Roccos!
- Turn left onto Carmine and walk past Joe's Pizza, where several scenes in *Spiderman* were filmed. Continue the zigzagged streets to Washington Square Park. This site was once a late 18th Century cemetery and ten thousand bodies were excavated to create the park.
- 8. The **Memorial Arch** commemorates Washington's inauguration and leads the way to Fifth Avenue.
- **Ends: Fifth Avenue and West Eighth Street** Subway: Eighth & Broadway (Right off 5th Avenue onto Washington Mews to Broadway)

<u>SOHO</u>

Starts: Thompson and Canal Street

Nearest subway station: Thompson and Canal Street

- Start your walk up Canal Street towards Broadway, shopping the street vendors on the way. You can practice your bartering skills for handbags, jewelry, scarves, music, and other New York accessories. But be careful what you buy! Some things are too good to be true!
- Turn left onto Broadway to continue your shopping. This is SoHo's main street for shopping name brands such as Guess, Hollister, Aldo, Desigual, A/X, and many more!
- Turn left onto Broome Street. At 453 Broome Street, you will find the Gourmet Garage, known for its use of organic produce. Stop in and try a "Starving Artist" sandwich and a fresh fruit smoothie.
- Turn right onto Greene Street to see the 13 cast-iron building fronts. Turn right onto Spring Street to stop in the unique store, Evolution. Continue down the street back to Broadway. (Continue down Spring Street past Broadway to Lafayette Street for the Little Italy Walking Tour pg. 50-51)
- 5. Turn left on Broadway for more shopping!
- 6. 555 Broadway: French cosmetics chain, Sephora.
- 7. 561 Broadway: Singer Building Once home to the offices of the famous sewing company. Across the street is the New York sandwich shop Dean and DeLuca whose success has seen them grow to a large chain with locations throughout the city. Stop in for a coffee and a slice of chocolate and nut "magic cake".

Ends: Prince Street and Broadway

Nearest subway station: Prince Street and Broadway

***Optional:** You may continue shopping **Broadway** to **W. Houston Street**. At W. Houston, turn right to reach the Subway stop at Broadway and Lafayette Street.


Starts: Fifth Avenue and East 51st Street

Nearest subway station: Underground Concourse

- 1. On the corner of **Fifth Avenue** and **East 51st Street** is **St Patrick's Cathedral.**
- 2. Walk down Fifth Avenue and stop in at Sak's Fifth Avenue on the corner of East 50th. Across the street, wander up the Promenade between the British Empire and La Maison Francaise (The French Building). Take the time to relax for a few moments in the Channel Gardens to watch workers, tourists, and shoppers bustle by. The gardens are also a great place for a nice view of the Prometheus Statue and the GE Building.
- 3. Continue up the Promenade to find the **sunken Lower Plaza** that is home to a cafe and garden in the summertime and the famous ice rink and Christmas tree during the winter months.
- At No. 10 Rockefeller Plaza crowds gather to watch the filming of NBC's the Today Show each morning. Pop in next door to the NBC Experience Store.
- No. 30 Rockefeller Plaza is the old RCA Building which is now home to General Electric and NBC Studios. On the 65th floor of the GE Building is the most famous restaurant in the complex, the Rainbow Room.
- Venture inside the front entrance of the GE Building and then downstairs to discover the underground shopping mall that connects the complex's 14 main buildings. These underground tunnels are formally known as the Underground Concourse, but are often referred to as the Catacombs.
- Next door to the GE Building at No. 50 you will see the old headquarters of the Associated Press, which recently moved locations after calling Rockefeller Center home for over 65 years.
- Turn right down East 50th Street between the GE and AP buildings. On your right is Radio City Music Hall, No. 1260 Avenue of the Americas, home of the Rockettes.
- 9. Lastly, return to the Catacombs to explore the underground world of shopping and restaurants. The Catacombs also provide subway access.

5th & Madison Ave

Starts: 59th Street and Lexington Avenue

Nearest subway station: 59th Street and Lexington

- Start your journey by popping into the world famous Bloomingdale's, created by the Bloomingdale brothers who first opened shop in 1856 selling hooped skirts.
- Turn right onto Lexington Avenue and left along East 61st Street to Madison Avenue. Turn left along Madison Avenue, where you will find a plethora of exclusive boutiques and the renowned Barneys New York.
- As you continue down Madison, take a quick detour and stop in at DKNY on 60th Street. A little further down Madison Avenue is Sony Style, the electronics retail store below Sony headquarters. Next door (right) at East 57th Street is Niketown, the sportswear giant.
- 4. Also on East 57th is the world recognized designer **Hermes** and the **Chanel Boutique** at No. 5.
- 5. Continue down East 57th and turn left onto Fifth Avenue.
- Also on Fifth Avenue is Bergdorf Goodman, a great place to shop for all the major European and American designer clothes. At No. 757 is Tiffany and Co, turn around and at No. 725, the Trump Tower, where the popular reality TV show The Apprentice is filmed.
- Wander further down 5th Avenue to find the Disney Store at No. 711 and Warner Bros. Studio Store on East 57th Street. (Continue down 5th Avenue to 51st for the Rockefeller Center Walking Tour pg. 60-61)

Ends: Fifth Avenue and 53rd Street

Nearest subway station: Fifth Avenue and 53rd Street

Starts: Seventh Avenue and West 34th Street


Nearest subway station: 34th Street, Penn Street Station, Seventh Avenue

- At **7th** and **West 34th** is **Macy's**, "The World's Largest Store" famous for its sponsorship of the Thanksgiving Day Parade and Fourth of July Fireworks.
- 2. Leave Macy's via its **Broadway** exit. See **Herald Square**, the original location of the New York Herald of which all that remains is the clock.
- 3. A short way up **East 34th Street** is the **Empire State Building**. Exit onto **Fifth Avenue**. At No. 424 is **Lord and Taylor**, the department store that began the tradition of extravagant Christmas window displays.
- 4. Turn left onto West 40th Street at the New York Public Library. At No. 40 is the Gothic black and gold American Standard Building. Underneath the Parisian-style Bryant Park, where the NY Fashion week takes place twice a year, lies three million books in the library's storage facility.
- 5. Pass behind the library, right onto **42nd Street** and then right onto **Fifth Avenue** to access the entrance to the New York Public Library. Free one hour tours are offered at 11am and 2pm.
- 6. Walk down **41st Street** to see the **Grand Central Terminal** at **Park Avenue** (turn left onto Park Avenue). The **Oyster Bar** inside the magnificent station is known for having over 30 kinds of oysters and a variety of other seafood. Downstairs in the basement food hall you'll find pizza, fish and chips, and sushi.
- 7. Continue down **East 42nd Street** to 405 **Lexington Avenue** to see the world famous skyscraper, the **Chrysler Building.**

Ends: Lexington Avenue and East 42nd Street

Nearest subway station: Grand Central 42nd Street and Lexington Avenue

Starts: Times Square

Nearest subway station: Times Square and 42nd Street

- 1. **No. 1 Times Square** is where the ball drops on New Year's Eve. Walk down **42nd Street** to the **New Amsterdam Theater.** The theater was restored by Disney after years of severe dilapidation. Retrace your steps back towards One Times Square.
- 2. At No. 4 Times Square is the **Conde Nast Building** that has tiny cells on its surface to capture sunlight and convert it to electricity. This is also the world headquarters of Vogue, the New Yorker, and Vanity Fair.
- 3. Continue up **Broadway** to No. 1501 to see the Art Deco landmark of the **Paramount Building.**
- 4. Turn right to walk through the tiny **Shubert Alley** where actors used to line the western wall hoping for a part in a Shubert play.
- 5. Turn right onto **West 45th Street** to see the **Lyceum** at 149-57, the grandmother of New York theaters. Walk back to **7th Avenue** and up to **Duffy Square**, also known as **Actor's Square**.
- 6. At 1560 Broadway, you can pick up theater tickets at the **Times Square Visitor Center,** or just check out the New Year's celebration pictures in the entrance.
- 7. Turn right onto **50th Street.** At 50th and **6th Avenue**, the twin towers of the **Life and Chase Manhattan Buildings** indicate the end of the theater district. Across the street is **Radio City Music Hall.**
- 8. Continue up 50th Street and turn right into **Rockefeller Plaza** (*if you wish to take the Rockefeller Center Walking Tour, continue to 5th Avenue and start at St. Patrick's Cathedral see Walking Tour on page 60-61*).
- Continue down to **48th Street** and turn right. Turn left onto Avenue of Americas to see Diamond Row at **47th Street**. Almost every shop front in this area is either a pawn shop or a jewelry emporium.
- 10. Wander down Avenue of Americas until you reach the **Algonquin Hotel.** Here you can stop in this hidden jewel for a delicious cup of tea in the famous **Oak Room.**
